of people provided with emergency rental assistance and emergency housing services to prevent displacement and ensure a safe, affordable place to stay.

of children provided with the resources necessary to support their educational needs while out of school. In-home book deliveries, providing computers, and online tutoring are some of the ways that United Way's Rapid Response Fund recipients are adjusting to meet the needs of the community.

37,512

of adults that received the necessary medications, products, and services to address preexisting health conditions and ensure their physical and mental health during isolation and contact restrictions.

United Way of the Greater Triangle launched a Rapid Response Fund on March 16 in direct response to the COVID-19 pandemic.
